What is the 'South Calgary Hockey House League?'

The South Calgary Hockey House League (SCHHL) began in 2015-2016 and is a partnership of the following Hockey Associations, which are **sponsored by the Flames Community Hockey House League:**

- Bow Valley Hockey Society
- Knights Hockey Club
- Southwest Hockey Association
- Wolverines Hockey Club

What is the 'Flames Community Hockey House League'?

The **Flames Community Hockey House League** is a partnership between the Calgary Flames Organization, Hockey Calgary, and its member Associations. The goal is to provide recreational players the opportunity to play organized hockey that is; **affordable, fun** and **safe**, with **moderate, consistent**, time & location commitments; allowing for participation in other social, academic or recreational activities. It also provides players who have limited skills and knowledge; an introduction to the game in a less intimidating format. The program is regionally based, offering participants a chance to play the great game of hockey, with less time and travel commitments.





What Age Categories will this program be offered to?

For the 2023-2024 season, the SCHHL will be offered to players in the following Age Divisions;

What's NEW this year?



- There will be two (2) 'Pathway Skates' scheduled prior to your 'Placement Skates'.
- Pathway Skates allow players to get back onto the ice in a less formal setting before the Placement Skates occur.
- While Pathway Skates are not mandatory; they are highly recommended.
- These will be scheduled by your 'home' Association.



- Hockey Calgary is excited to host a House League Jamboree, which is currently planned for February 2023.
- House League teams from all across the city are eligible to participate, in this fun "tournament like" event.

What Equipment is Required?

- Full equipment is **ALWAYS** required; as per Hockey Calgary Guidelines.
 - \circ Equipment list; including sizing and care \rightarrow https://www.hockeycalgary.ca/resources/equipment-care
 - Mouth guards ARE mandatory, as per the Hockey Calgary Regulations Handbook.
- Participants must have their own practice jersey and practice socks.
- Goalie gear will be provided to the U9 Age Division. If U11 teams require goalie gear, it will be provided by the League; on request.









How will Team Compositions Look?

Participant assessments (evaluated skates) will be conducted within each 'home' Association to ensure teams are equally balanced with a variety of skill level.

House League Program Highlights;

- All teams must adhere to the Hockey Calgary (HCAL) Operations Guide.
- All SCHHL teams will be sanctioned by HCAL. All players and coaches must be properly registered.
- House League games for U9 & U11 will only be against other SCHHL teams.
- Team placement for participants is determined through a Participant Placement Process.
- No previous hockey experience is necessary, but basic skating IS required.
 - o This is **NOT** a "learn to skate" program.
 - Participants should have the basic fundamentals of skating including; stopping, gliding, turning, moving backwards and proper technique for falling down and getting up.
- Games will be played in accordance with the Hockey Calgary Rules & Regulations.
- Statistics and standings will not be kept or publicly displayed.
- Official game reports for all games will be entered into the HCAL website for review purposes only.
- The score clock will never reflect a differential greater than 5 goals regardless of the actual score.
- A player is limited to 3 goals during any one game however may earn unlimited assists. If a player scores a
 4th goal etc., the goal will not be recorded and a face off will occur at center ice.
- All <u>player</u> positions must be rotated equitably throughout the season in both the U9 & U11 divisions.
- The goalie position will be rotated in U9, and 'may' be rotated in U11; dependent on the registered goalies.
- Participants may be named Captain or Alternate Captain on a fair and rotating basis as per your home Association policy.
- Coaches are permitted to use up to 25% of their practice ice to scrimmage within their own team.
- NO Affiliations are permitted between House League and the Community/Regional Stream.

Is a Volunteer Bond Required?

This league also requires volunteers; in order for the program to operate efficiently.

- A Volunteer Bond Program is determined <u>by your 'home' Association</u>. check with your Association regarding additional commitment(s) that may be required of you.
- Specific volunteer duties may be required such as, but not limited to; game day roles, team level roles, (i.e., Coaches, Managers, Jersey Parent), Association level or League duty roles.









What will the Program Scheduling be like?

- Games and practices will be scheduled for the duration of the season; according to the Program Scheduling notes within this document.
- Each teams' schedule will be posted to the Hockey Calgary website.
- Families can also access their schedule through TeamSnap; which is assigned per 'home' Association.
- There will be one (1) practice held during the week and one (1) game held <u>on either</u> Saturday or Sunday; with the exception of the weeks mentioned on Page 1.
- Program scheduling is completed per 'home' Association based on their ice availability.

NOTE: The EARLIER ice times noted for practices and games are the ones predominately scheduled.

The specific days of your team's practices and games <u>WILL NOT BE</u> communicated, in advance to your team placement.

What are the Coaching Requirements?

Did you know...this program is run by volunteer Coaches FROM THE PARENT GROUP?

Interested Coaches need to register, and following the procedure as set out by your 'home' Association.

- Coaches <u>MUST</u> have completed <u>ALL</u> required course certifications as per the Hockey Canada, Hockey Alberta, Hockey Calgary & Association Rules & Regulations by the November 15th deadline.
- Safety Certification is mandatory for some Associations, but is strongly recommended for ALL coaches.
- U9 teams are required to have <u>two (2) individuals certified as a Head Coach</u>.
- Coach Certification costs will be reimbursed 100%, by your 'home' Association.

NOTE: Online courses **DO NOT** need to be completed in one sitting. **However**, **THEY DO** need to be completed as a pre-requisite to any in-person ice/classroom course.

NOTE #2: There MUST BE a Coach in attendance for EVERY ice time, who has the Safety Certification.

Deadline to complete required "IN-PERSON" certifications is November 15, 2023









What do I need to know about Registration?

- SPACE IS LIMITED!! Register Early to avoid disappointment!
- Respect in Sport (RIS) Parent <u>MUST</u> be completed by one (1) Parent/Guardian <u>BEFORE</u> the online registration is started.
 - A completed registration MUST HAVE the Respect in Sport Certification with a valid expiration date.
- Hockey fees for the House League are different than the Community Minor Hockey Program mainly due to the different ice requirements.
- All interested families are to contact their 'home' Association to register.
- Registrants are only able to participate in one (1) League for the current hockey season.

Completed registrations will remain under "My Registrations" for the <u>current</u> season. Registration receipts <u>cannot</u> be brought back after they expire!!	
	It is strongly advised to print receipts once payments have all been completed.	









Are there Financial Assistance Opportunities?

There are programs available to assist families with the financial cost of registration. You must apply and qualify for these financial assistance programs. It's important for you to **register EARLY** so that you have full access to **ALL** the financial assistance opportunities. If you are not sure about something "please" contact your 'home' Association Registrar as soon as possible.



If your application is approved by Hockey Calgary then that automatically qualifies you for equipment assistance through the Calgary Flames Sports Bank. The information about the equipment bank will be provided to you on your approved application notice.



It's important for you to <u>REGISTER EARLY</u> so that you have full access to ALL financial assistance opportunities. If you're not sure about something "please" contact your 'home' Association Registrar ASAP. Contact information is below.

 - Be sure to check your 'junk mail' for the automated email. Your 'home' Registrar will also receive an automated email.
- It is the <u>members' responsibility</u> to follow up with Hockey Calgary regarding the status of their application.
